Provides financial assistance for lifesaving veterinary care where the outcome is expected to be positive if care is offered, must apply for CareCredit before applying.

Provides financial assistance for curable, lifesaving (not life-prolonging) care such as tumors, broken bones, ambulatory care, expensive medication, or post-surgical prosthetics.
